St. Basil's: The Collegiate Church

Administered by the Brazilian Fathers Est. 1856

Since 1856, the students, faculty and staff of the University of St. Michael's College contemplated their lives and purpose of education inside the walls of St. Basil's Church. Today, St. Basil's is the most recognised Catholic symbol of the College, both as a building and as a centre of the sacramental life. The towering steeple rises above the campus for all to see, and its message is amplified across the country through the national broadcast of its daily mass.

The Brazilian Fathers continue to preach and teach goodness, and discipline to this day. As the "Mother Church" of the Brazilians, it serves as a gathering place not only for the University teachers and staff, but also for the community.

This was the wish of Captain John Elmsley (1801-1863), a wealthy entrepreneur, a naval officer, and philanthropist of his time - that a college and church be built on his donated land. He was a firm believer in the strength of education and the grace of the Eucharist. As was his wish, his heart was enshrined in the wall of St. Basil's. A marble monument stands in honour of his memory.

We are very grateful to the St. Basil's Parish to have accommodated our Reunion Mass and to help celebrate this very special occasion in appreciation of our Maryknoll Sisters.
