Excerpt from letter by Sr. Mary Lou Daovst, M.M. August 30, 2000



1921 - 2000

Sister Theresa Perkes died peacefully of cerebrovascular disease on Friday, August 25, 2000 in the Residential Care Unit of the Maryknoll Sisters Center. She was seventy-nine years of age and had been a Maryknoll Sister for nearly fifty-one years.

Theresa Mary Perkes was born in Birmingham, England on June 16, 1921, the eldest of four children born to James and Marina Poole Perkes. She had two brothers and one sister. When Theresa was three years of age, the family emigrated from England to Canada settling in Manitoba. Theresa attended St. Michael's Academy in Brandon and graduated from Flin Flon High School in 1936. After completing a one year commercial course at St. Mary's College in Winnipeg, she worked as a stenographer for the Hudson Bay Mining and smelting Company. Theresa attended the University of Manitoba from 1944-1948, graduating with a Bachelor of Science degree in Chemistry. She returned

to the Hudson Bay Company as a research chemist for one year before entering the Maryknoll Sisters Congregation on Sept. 9, 1948 at Maryknoll, NY.

In 1952, Theresa was assigned as an elementary school teacher to teach at Transfiguration School in Chinatown, NY where she taught until 1956 when she was assigned to Hong Kong. Theresa taught chemistry, physics and general science at Maryknoll Convent School for the next fifteen years. In 1971, Theresa became principal of Maryknoll Sisters School and continued in this position until 1976. Theresa loved teaching and found it challenging and satisfying. She wrote: There is a special bond between teacher and students which lasts a lifetime. My life was greatly enriched by my years of working with Chinese students. There was pain and joy in watching them leave and mature, in sharing their struggles and successes.

After suffering the first of what would be many minor strokes, Theresa returned to the Center in 1990 after serving in Panama-Nicaragua, Bolivia and El Salvador. She was assigned to Monrovia in 1992 where she remained active in social justice issues. In 1998, she returned to NY because of increasing health problems.

Greetings from Maryknoll, New York where I arrived a short week ago, having finished my Renewal time with family in St. Louis, MO.

One of my first aims was to visit Sr. Teresa in our nursing home where I knew she had gone after her second stroke. However, Sr. was incapable of recognizing me. Knowing that Sisters could volunteer to be on a prayer vigil with her, I signed up for ten to eleven p.m. I simply sat by the bedside reciting aloud prayers for the dying and singing hymns. The second night - that was last Friday - I did the same thing until a member of Sr.'s entry group to Maryknoll, took over from me. Her name is Loretta, so I explained to Loretta that Teresa would not be groaning as she had done the previous night because she was too weak to utter that much sound. Also, she was running a fever and the nurse was coming in every 15 minutes or so to wet her lips with a dauber and to replace the wet cloth on her forehead.

Loretta took the prayer book I'd been using and I left. It was 11:05 p.m. by Teresa's clock. Saturday, morning I was just going into chapel for Mass when Loretta took my hand and said, "Rose, you could not have gotten back to your bedroom

when Teresa took her last breath!" I chided the good Lord for not letting a Hong Kong Sister be beside her for her last moment. .

Now she is resting peacefully in God's acre. The funeral was this morning. Mary Lou Teufel, Miriam Xavier Mug and I were three of the pallbearers. I'll always remember Teresa for the gracious way in which she welcomed me to MCS when I became principal in 1965 and how she was foresightful at times in preparing me for what was expected of me -- that is if I wanted to be faithful to the former way of accomplishing things.

I must stop now with a loving prayer for all the needs of all our Maryknollers in Toronto.
