I was privileged to represent Canada East with the First Reading and the Responsorial Psalm. Fr. Marciano's homily was very moving as he talked about the Maryknoll Sisters' dedication and their influence on the lives of the students. He also stressed that it is up to all Mayknollers to continue that influence on the lives of those whom we come in contact with.
