am very excited to announce a first-ever event organized by the Maryknoll Sisters: United Through Mission Gala Celebration to be held at the United Nations Headquarters in New York on Friday, October 14, 2016. (Click on the picture for a larger view)

It will be an event of fun and fundraising. There will be a raffle and silent auction. Ms. Shelley Lee of Class of 1966 will speak about Maryknoll Spirit in her life. Most importantly, we will present the Maryknoll Sisters Humanitarian Award in Patriotism to Mr. Bob Woodruff, ABC's Foreign Correspondent for Asia.

Besides being teachers, Maryknoll Sisters journey to many parts of the world to serve those most in need. From the beginning of the Congregation in 1912 to the present day, our Sisters have walked with many peoples through war, illness, abuse, neglect, poverty, and social injustice. We bring hope, peace, and pathways to a better life to the marginalized, who are often voiceless -- especially women. Our Foundress Mother Mary Joseph said in 1930, "There can be no Maryknoll Sister, worthy of the name who is not heroically generous to the very last inch of her being." Our goal to "make God's love visible," is the foundation of our work, beginning with our mission to China in 1921 to the present day.

Why the United Nations? For more than 18 years, the Maryknoll Office of Global Concerns has had a Sister with NGO Observer status. She uses education and advocacy for peace, social justice, and integrity of creation. Additionally, Sisters in

Africa focus on caring for orphans with HIV/AIDS.

Peru give voice to the indigenous people whose existence is threatened by human-induced climate change and water pollution. Cambodia aid victims of human trafficking.

China work with handicapped individuals and train nurses for the elderly in nursing homes, and

Bangladesh give hope by teaching young girls.

Dear Fellow Alumni Members:




ning together with delicious food and an informative session with Daniel Wong, husband of Winnie Wong (1973), on how to

have our BGM on a Sunday afternoon so that we can all enjoy the beautiful scenery at Donalda and avoid night driving in the Fall.



Our Condolences



Mr. Cheung Kin Kwok, Francis passed away peacefully in Toronto on June 18, surrounded by his children Teresa, Rose (MCS class of 1982), Joseph, Cecilia, Anthony and grandson Nicholas. He was 85 years old.

Born in 1931, Francis was the third of six children. His family moved to Hong Kong when he was 15. With perseverance, hard work, and a magnetic personality,. he created Cheung's Film Production Company in Hong

Kong in the 60's. His businesses grew, expanding across Asia -Taipei, Singapore, Indonesia, Thailand and Philippines. In 1966, he wrote and directed his first feature film The Super Eight of Peace Mountain. In 1980, Francis and his family immigrated to Toronto, Canada settling in North York.

As founder & chairman of Chinavision, he launched the first national Chinese cable pay TV in Canada in 1984. In 1988, he launched Chinavision via satellite reaching over 90% Chinese population across Canada. His vision and dedication bridged the cultural divides in this great country.

He will be dearly missed by his family, friends and colleagues.
