On July 24, our committee sent out an e-blast calling on our members to support the September Maryknoll Fund Raising Gala by buying a raffle

Once the committee receives the money for the tickets, the ticket purchaser is acknowledged by email. As each batch of 120 tickets are sold, a spreadsheet with the names of the purchasers is sent to the Motherhouse. Sr. Rosalie, the Sister in charge of this project, hand writes the purchaser's name on the ticket and identifies our Toronto tickets with a big 'T'. The tickets are placed in the tombola, anxiously waiting for the September 7 draw at the Ellis Island Gala. (All this happens within 48 hours!). The committee will bring the money collected to the Motherhouse on our upcoming bus trip on September 14 – 17. (Please come with us! There is still space on our fun bus!)
