The highlight of the evening arrived when Wendy went on stage and thanked all the Maryknoll husbands who supported our events over the years. After a round of applause, the Maryknoll 姑爺s were invited to go up to the front and take a group photo to commemorate our Gala. It was a hilarious sight watching Dr. Jeffrey Fong leading the singing with the normally very serious gentlemen joining in the chorus. At the end of the song, Nena asked the husbands to invite their

nne, Eulogy Juliana Shee Joe, MCS 1955

r. Corinne was born on July 29, 1917 in Jefferson City, Missouri by the Mississippi River of a happy religious family. She went to heaven on Sept. 1, 2019 at Maryknoll Motherhouse, Ossining, New York, at the ripe age of 102.

Sr. Corinne entered the Maryknoll Sisters Novitiate in 1937. She spent most of her life devoted to religion and music. She received her B.A. in music with minor in piano from Manhattanville College of the Sacred Heart, N.Y. in 1942. Her joy and

knowledge of music would be part of her every mission assignment. First she was assigned to L.A. as a music director for oriental children. In 1946 she was assigned to Hong Kong where she taught religion and music and gave piano lessons at Maryknoll Convent School. It was there we had the good fortune to get to know Sr. Corinne. She was our music teacher for many years during which time she founded the beautiful girls choir, *The Glee Club*. She entered us in many inter-school music competitions and we won great honours under her tutorship.

In music classes, Sr. also introduced us to classical music appreciation of great composers, identification of musical instruments and also singing the Latin Mass hymns. My nursing classmates in England were so surprised that I could sing the Kyrie Eleison and Gloria in Excelsis Deo in Latin.

Sr. later became the principal of the primary section of the school until she reached 60, the mandatory retirement age in Hong Kong. In 1996, she officially retired to Maryknoll Sisters retirement home in Monrovia, California.

Sr. Corinne touched many students in different ways. For me personally, I owe much to her for introducing me to appreciate music in all its forms. When she visited Toronto in the 1990s, I took her to attend a concert at Roy Thompson Hall, *The Symphony "Pictures at an Exhibition"* by Mussorgsky. She was so thrilled as she whispered in my ears the various instruments of the orchestra, the same way that she had taught us at school when I was a teenager.



Sr. Corinne now can listen to symphonies all day long with angels playing in the heavenly orchestra. May she rest in peace. It would be her turn to take me to the concert when my time on earth has come to en end.
